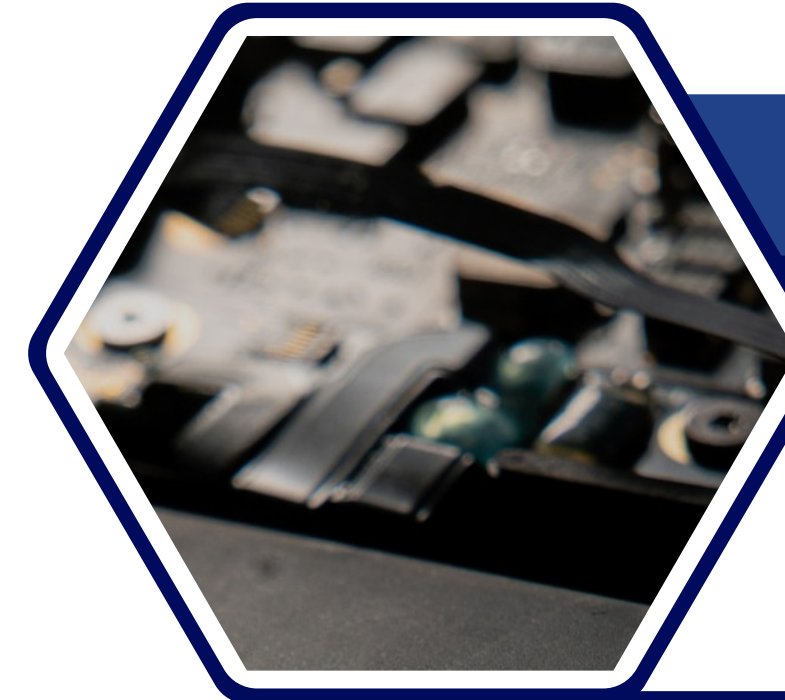

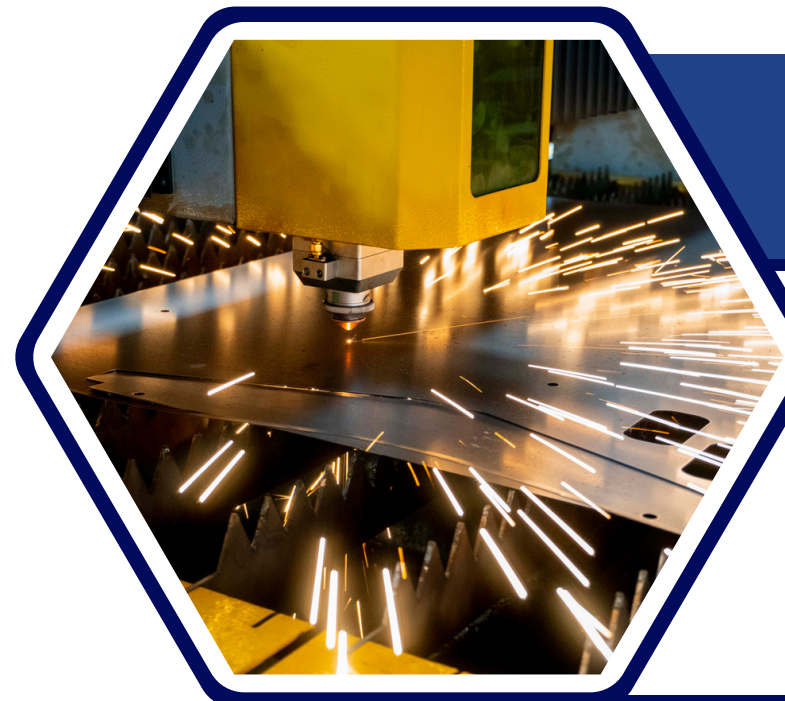
BATTERY REGULATION

The regulation on batteries aims to create a circular economy for the batteries sector by targeting all stages of the life cycle of batteries, from design to waste treatment



CRITICAL RAW MATERIALS

Critical Raw Materials (CRMs) are raw materials that are economically and strategically important for the European economy, but have a high-risk associated with their supply.



MACHINERY SAFETY LEGISLATION & STANDARDS

The Machinery Regulation lays down the requirements and conformity assessment procedures that machinery has to fulfill before they are allowed to be sold or used in the European Union market.



EU LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK FOR TYPE APPROVAL & PMDs

EU legislative framework that covers cargo bikes, e-bikes/speed pedelecs, electric step and segways /monowheels.

MOBILITY TRANSITION PATHWAY (MTP) PRIORITIES

1. Stimulating cycling demand / market

Investing in safe and efficient cycling infrastructure.

3. EU co-funding for industrial projects

Providing opportunities for cluster programs (both for existing cluster and for the development of new ones) and R&D&I projects.

2. Sound EU regulatory & standards framework

Keeping e-bikes outside of type approval, reasonable battery legislation that doesn't overburden the industry, considering cyclists (always as VRUs) on par with other road users in any new legislation related to CCAM.

4. EU battery ecosystem & circularity

Set up a battery task force, promote circular economy, reduce dependencies on third countries, and promote the creation of innovative sorting and recycling hubs.

5. Workforce & skills

Enabling skills development and training, including engineers, designers, technicians, and salespeople.
